Willard Wigan is the creator of the world smallest hand made artworks in history.

As a young boy Willard found both reading and writing did not come naturally to him. At that time autism and learning difficulties were virtually not recognised. He was told by school teachers that he would amount to nothing and would achieve nothing.

Growing up his mother often told him that the smaller he made things the bigger his name would become, she would often tell him that his work wasn't small enough and that he should try again. This inspired him to make things increasingly smaller, now he can make things in beautiful detail often smaller than a full stop in a newspaper.

Willard sculpted a portrait of the Queen on a coffee bean; he described creating the work as: "...a bit of a challenge because a coffee bean crumbles and is hollow in the middle".
