

Arts Mark Programme

As a school we have signed up to the Arts Mark Programme. It is a creative quality standard for schools, accredited by Arts Council England. By completing the award, it shows that we give value to the Arts. Working as part of a collaboration, which includes Stanley Common, Mapperley, Morley, Breadsal, Lons Infants, Kilburn Infants, Street lane, Denby and Horsley collectively known as the Skylark small school cluster.

The arts ambassadors, Ollie and Ruby, will be working with Mrs Adshead and children from these schools to develop a range of activities to support us achieving the Arts Mark.



School Improvement plan

Writing – To aid improvement in writing, children need to be exposed to quality text. So we have focused on improving the books we have in school by purchasing lots of new literature.

- We have spent £1,700 on new reading scheme books
- £200 on intervention – Code X Books
- £500 on general reading books from the book fair

As well as having great materials in school we need to encouraging the children to read them. With this in mind, the new 'Reading for Meaning and Reading for Fun' section is now on the **Parents** section of the school website:
