## School Uniform

Governors have recently reviewed and revised our school uniform policy and a copy of this can be found on our school website. You can also request a paper copy from the school office. Previously we have had a grey cardigan or jumper as part of our school uniform, however, in order to ensure we can easily identify our children when we are taking part in out of school trips and activities we are now asking all parents to ensure their child has a royal blue cardigan or jumper.

Please also be advised that children should not wear earrings of any sort when in school and nail varnish should also not be worn.

### Clubs

Please ensure that if your child is signed up to an after school activity club which requires appropriate clothing and/or equipment that they have these in school. We have a lot of children who are unprepared! If your child does not have the required equipment and/or clothing to take part in an activity or club, they may need to be put in the after school club which will incur a charge equal to the difference between the cost of the activity and the cost of the after school club (currently £2).
