
All classes will have a teaching assistant each morning to support with teaching core subjects and in the afternoons they will be carrying out interventions where needed.

First Aid

All of the Juniors have passed their emergency first aid training in June. We consider this an important life skill to enable them to react positively and confidently in the event of an incident when they are away from school. As part of the training, the children learnt CPR and how to use a defibrillator (AED) which is a vital piece of life saving equipment. AED's are becoming increasingly available in many towns and villages because of their proven life saving record. Stanley St Andrew's would like to get a Defibrillator installed outside the school gates so that it is accessible to the whole community in an emergency.
