Parenthub

Reminder - Open Door Policy

Please remember that if you are unsure about anything which is happening in school or you have any concerns about your child, you can come and talk to either the class teacher, myself or Katy/Julie in the school office. If you can't get in to school, then you can always give us a call.

Please do not report your child as being ill, late or having a medical appointment via email as most mornings are busy and it can be late in the day before our emails are checked. Also, if our emails are not working we could potentially miss your communication.

The office opens from 8am and our first task is to check the answer machine to see if there are any absences which need to be recorded. If we haven't heard from you by close of register at 9.05am, this is the procedure which will be followed: text and phone call to priority contact. If we receive no answer, we will then go through the list of contacts that we hold for your child. If we are still unable to contact someone to ascertain why your child is not in school, we will need to call social care to make them aware of a child missing education.

So please, if your child is not going to be in school, it is vital that you let us know by 9.05am that same day. It is also really important to make sure that if your contact number changes, or any of the contact numbers we hold for your child changes, you inform the school as soon as possible.

School Improvement

Our focus this year for School Improvement is outcomes in Maths for all children and so it is really important that all of our parents support their children with the homework that is set for them. You can also help your child by practising their times tables with them and by giving them the experience of handling money. You can also support your child with Environmental Maths, for example, how far away a place is, as well as simple everyday tasks such as telling the time. All of these basic activities will support our children's learning and help achieve our School Improvement priorities.

If your child's reading record shows that they have read to a parent at least three times in that week, they will be entered into our raffle to win one of a range of fabulous prizes.
