
I hope that you have had a lovely half term break with family and friends. It has been lovely to enjoy the wonderful weather and appreciate the beauty of living in Derbyshire.

Medicines in school.

Please can I remind parents that children must not be sent into school with medicine. We have had a number of children arriving in school with medicines in book bags, which clearly is a health and safety risk. All prescribed medicines must be handed into the office where parents will be requested to fill out a form so staff are clear as to when it should be given and what the medicine is for. It is essential that any medicines being given to children are prescribed by a doctor, we cannot give medicines brought over the counter. Medicines must be in the original box with the pharmacy label still attached.

If your child is unwell please take them to see a doctor or pharmacist as we are unable to diagnose children's illness in school.

Breakfast Club and After School Club

Just a reminder that breakfast club starts at 8am and the children have the opportunity to have toast, a full range of cereal and yoghurt.

Once the children have had breakfast they have a number of activities that they can do, such as: complete homework, use the computers, creative crafts and play games. The breakfast club can be used in an emergency as there are always a few members of staff on to cover, so if you need to go into work earlier and are stuck for child care, just turn up.

After school club runs from 3.15 until 6pm.

All children need to be booked in, as I need to ensure there is sufficient staff to cover.

<u>Parking</u>

Please can we ask all our parents/visitors to be mindful when parking at the start and the end of the school day, as we have been informed that parents are parking on the pavement outside the church, which is restricting accessibility for pushchairs and wheelchair access. Also pedestrians access has been compromised.
