It is essential that we have the correct mobile numbers, to ensure that in the event of a closure all children are collected and staff are not put at risk. Please start to think about what plans you have in place for bad weather, it is essential that we know who your nominated person to collect your child is. For example, parents in Oakwood might nominate one parent to collect a number of children. Village children may have one person who is going to come and collect them and keep the children with them. Snow is a time where we need to work together and ensure the safety of everyone, whether that be driving, or walking, please be patient. In years gone by, we have asked that parents help to move snow over the weekends and make the path down to school safe, this again will be done via text message.

India Appeal

I am sure you will recall that the Diocese challenged all church schools to raise £200 for the Kolkata appeal. I am pleased to say that from all the hard work put in by Lily in Golden Eagles, we have been able to achieve the target. All money raised has come from our tuck shop, so thank you to all the parents and grandparents that supported such a great cause. We also owe thanks to Sarah and Gary from the post office who donated the first items to sell and Liz Jackson for her kind donation. After a discussion with the RE Ambassadors, they would like to keep the tuck shop going in the New Year. We thought it would be nice if any profits made could be split between our Indian school link and a small project that also benefits us as a school. If there is a parent out there who would like to take on the role of purchasing the stock and working with the children to keep an audit of their books, please see me. The role would be buying the stock and ensuring that everything is in date and ready for selling each Friday. The role does not require you to be involved in the selling each Friday, that will be done by the RE Ambassadors.

This year, rather than doing the shoe box appeal, which we believe most people spent about £5 to fill, we thought we would raise money for our Indian school and for the homeless locally. The reason we have chosen these two appeals is because: our link school will need basic resources such as pencils, paper, glue and scissors which will be purchased when I visit in January. In order to support the local economy, I have been advised to take sterling out and purchase the items at the local market. Apparently £100 will set the school up for half a year. This is such a contrast to what we spend on stationary in our little school.

In collective worship the children have been talking about the real purpose of Christmas. From our discussions the children realise that we are very fortunate that we all have somewhere warm and safe to sleep and lots of food to eat. We are mindful that this is not the case for all people in the UK and Derby so we are going to work closely with the Diocese to help feed families. A food bag for a family of four cost £30. We are aiming to raise enough money for four food bags which will total £120.

Lily from Golden Eagles met with a local business man John Oldfield, who owns the Alfa garage in Derby, after telling him all about the work we have been doing for India, Lily asked if he would match fund what we raise. He was more than happy to match fund us and will be visiting school once we confirm how much we have raised. Once we have our total for meal in a bag, we will be taking a small group of children on 22nd of December to give up some of their time to help pack the bags to go out to needy families.

With all this in mind the RE Ambassadors have decided that on 16th of December all children will be able to donate £1 to come to school in non-uniform. All children will get the chance to decorate a cake or biscuit which they can buy at the end of the school day.

If anyone feels able to support this challenge by sending in cakes, biscuits and decorating icing we would be very grateful. Please send decorating items and biscuit in as soon as possible, cakes need to come in on Friday 16th December in the morning.

Thank you to all staff this year rather than sending Christmas cards we have agreed to support the Indian challenge by donating money.
