Head Bumps & First Aid in School

Having received feedback from parents on the number of head bump notices that are issued by school, we wanted to clarify our procedure for head bumps and first aid. Any incident occurring in school which involves a child bumping their head or injuring any part of their face will be reported back to parents via a head bump notice on Parenthub. Sometimes staff may not have seen exactly what happened and so we will report any injury to the head or face as a possible head bump to ensure that you keep an eye on your child for any possible symptoms of concussion. This is purely a precautionary message and not intended to cause alarm. Please be reassured that if we felt any injury was more serious we would call home and ask you to take your child to be checked over.

Parents of Robin's children may feel at times that their child is always bumping their head and we do issue more head bump notices to our Robins parents than any other class. This is because our Robins class participate in free flow activities throughout the day meaning they are moving around more and reaching for resources, perhaps at the same time as another child. This does lead to more head bumps than we would see in other classes who spend more lesson time seated at their desks.

If your child has an accident in school that is not classed as a head bump, we will make contact with parents if we think you need to be aware of this accident, and we will always contact parents if we feel a child may need further treatment. We do record all accidents and injuries that happen in school so if you do have any concerns, or any feedback or suggestions, please let us know.

Attendance

We still have a number of children who are unwell, and it is really important that any emails relating to absence are sent directly to the school office as these emails are monitored throughout the day by our admin team. The email address to use to report absence is schooladmin@st-andrews-pri.derbyshire.sch.uk.

We appreciate that it is difficult to get doctors, dentist, hospital and opticians appointments at the moment, but we do ask that you make every effort to arrange these for outside of school hours. If you do need to take your child out of school for any appointment, then we do require you to provide an appointment card or other confirmation when advising the school of any absence.

Can I also remind our parents that holidays in term time are not permitted and if you do take your child out of school during term time without prior authorisation from the school this may result in the local authority issuing a penalty notice to each parent for each child that is absent. We also ask that you consider the impact of your child's absence not only on your child, but also their classmates, as it takes time for our teaching staff to help a child catch up on what they may have missed and this is time which is taken away from teaching others.

If you are planning to take your child out of school during term time, then you will need to complete a leave of absence request form. In certain exceptional circumstances your request may be authorised, but this is at the discretion of the headteacher and the governing body.

Children left unsupervised

We have a number of children who are being left unsupervised outside the school gates in the morning sometimes for over half an hour before the time when our gates open. This is simply not safe. If your child was to be taken or wandered off it could be up to an hour before the register is completed and we realise they are not in school. If you do need to get to work or elsewhere early, then please use our breakfast club or consider car sharing so we can ensure your child is safe.



Parents evening will be taking place on Wednesday 6th and Thursday 7th April 2022. We will be offering face to face appointments in school as well as virtual appointments and telephone appointments. Information about booking these will be sent out after half term.

Parent's evening appointments are an opportunity for parents to be updated by their child's teaching team about their progress and what parents can do to support them further. If you have any concerns about your child, either in terms of their wellbeing, their progress or anything else, please don't wait until parents evening to raise these. Please contact your child's teacher or the headteacher to discuss these concerns as soon as they arise so that we can make time to properly consider these concerns and how best we can address them.


